



CHECKLIST

For the ideal loading of the motorhomes



LOADING

Every kilo counts. Therefore, pay close attention to what you take with you. Because the 3.5t total weight of your Carado - including the load - must not be exceeded. On the one hand, this could result in a hefty fine (and in Germany also points in Flensburg), and on the other hand, a different driving licence is usually required for vehicles weighing more than 3.5t. By the way, you can weigh your vehicle at any time at your local technical testing organisations. You know: less weight also means lower fuel consumption.

IMPORTANT

If you distribute your load cleverly, you not only ensure more safety, but also efficient use of space. Heavy objects are well stored in the floor compartments between the axles. Lash them down with a belt and nothing will slip during the journey. Bulky items can be stored in the shower or in the wardrobes. The floor compartments are a good place to stow bottles, for example. The rear garage has room for a grill, bicycles and camping furniture.

Surfboards and kayaks can be stored on the roof.

BASIC LOAD

Bagged meals instead of canned food

Dishes made of melamine instead of ceramic

Pots and pans made of aluminium instead of steel

E-books instead of books

App instead of camping guide

Take food only for daily needs

Wheel chocks

Awning retracted and skylights closed

Lashing straps for luggage fastening

VEHICLE

Sun sail instead of awning

Gas bottles made of aluminium instead of steel

"Frol" system instead of slatted frame

Lithium instead of lead batteries

Breakdown spray instead of spare wheel

Windscreen wiper water

Fill water tank only with 10 l

Only take the most important tools

Flush water systems and check for leaks
